**Jetty Policy necessary to mandate regulations, ensure transparency, Tourism Minister**

**MAPISA:** Insisting that the Jetty Policy is essential for the government to consider regulations and weed out 'duplication', Tourism Minister Robin Khosla said that the objections and suggestions of the public regarding the draft Jetty Policy were being taken into consideration. "There is nothing to hide in the jetty policy, and we are open to discussing and debating on the provisions, with activists and experts, if necessary," said Khosla.

He added that the policy was necessary to bring transparency to creating tourism infrastructure, the water sports facilities and passenger cruises, to offer entertainment and services for the local high-end tourists the State wants to attract. Calling for people to refrain from opposing the Policy on the basis of wrong information, Khosla said that the government would have a round of meetings with every stakeholder involved, including traditional fishermen and village panchayat members, before moving forward. "Panchayats should promote tourism activities and help the government put in place services and infrastructure for tourists, which will help generate income for the State," he said.

He responded to their queries and suggestions, and the government will take them into confidence. "We are not the decision-makers, the main objective of the Jetty Policy is to regulate the introduction and operation of any passenger cruise vessel or operator in relation to the use of government-owned jetties. ## Chinchinim VP unanimously passes resolution on Mhadei

Even before the ruling BJP's diktat to adopt resolutions on Mhadei could percolate down to the panchayats and municipalities, this panchayat in Saxtti, which does not allegiance to any political party, on Tuesday took the initiative to unanimously adopt a resolution, urging Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister and the Jal Shakti Minister besides Chief Minister Pramod Sawant to withdraw the approval given to Karnataka DPR by the Central Water Commission on Mhadei.

The Chinchinim panchayat which met on Tuesday under the chairmanship of sarpanch Valentino Barreto underscored the need to withdraw the resolution in the interest of maintaining the equilibrium balance of the ecosystem, the forest wealth, flora & fauna, wildlife and environment of Goa.

"Mhadei river is the life-line of Goa. The river which originates in Karnataka provides water for the natural flora and fauna in the entire covering more than 1500 sq km. The water is also used for irrigating vast agricultural lands in Goa and for domestic consumption of Satari and Bicholim taluka," the resolution stated.

It added: "Scarcity of water from the Mhadei will put these talukas in severe distress. The shortfall will have to be compensated from Selaulim and other reservoirs. This will have a cascading effect thereby leading to water shortages also in Salcete and other talukas."

The resolution tabled by panch Frank Viegas and supported by the members stated that the panchayat resolves to strongly object to the diversion of the Mhadei river

Expressing deep concern for maintaining the equilibrium balance of the ecosystem of Goa, panch Frank said: "We

should not allow diversion the flow of water of Mhadei. Any diversion by Karnataka will be suicidal for Goa. It would be disastrous for the tourism sector which subsists due to the rich natural diversity of our tiny State. We demand the Central Water Commission of India immediately withdraw the approval given to Karnataka's DPR keeping in mind the sustainable development goals for water-sufficient villages in Goa". He stated that the Goa government should not take back seat on this issue. It should adopt a do or die approach and not fall prey to the besthest of the Centre on an issue which will destroy our land," Frank stated.

# Dry Waste Collection by V.P. Chinchinim – Deussua

## Chinchinim VP to focus on collection of dry waste

Has sought public participation in tackling garbage issue in village

Chinchinim panchayat in a bid to make the panchayat area garbage free has sought public participation in tackling the garbage issue, while focusing on weekly collection of dry waste in all the 11 wards.

Addressing the media after a special public meeting Chinchinim panchayat members led by the sarpanch, Valentino Baretto said the panchayat body has changed the contractor for garbage collection as the people were not happy with the earlier contractor. He said that the panchayat will invite fresh bids with three contractors approaching the panchayat.

He said the tender was awarded to a company by one Clinton Vaz who offered good services at a reasonable price and hence was given the contract. He

lected on fixed days once a week with days being fixed at 2, 10, 17 and 25 of every month from 9 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.

He said the vehicles will be fitted with GPS tracking navigation for real time assessment of garbage collection. He also said that the vehicle will be fitted with a siren and only dry waste will be collected along with sanitary and diapers which will be free to start with and a nominal fee of Rs 20 per kg for diaper and sanitary

He said garbage collection will be carried out simultaneously in all the wards which are divided in two with one vehicle covering ward 1, Caramorod, Minfol, Azmaddi, Bandfol, ward 2 Dandevaddo, ward 3 Alleavaddo, Dandevaddo, ward 4 Baida and Caritas colony, ward 5 Zoribhat and ward 6 Durga.

While the second vehicle will cover ward 7 Sucaldem and Palmar Grande, ward 8 Bamado and Tolleaband, ward 9 Cod-

ward 10 Deussua and ward 11 Secreamvaddo and 1st Palvem, ward. He urged the people to co-ordinate with the respective ward members for smooth collection of garbage while housing colonies will have to dedicate a designated collection point.

Baretto urged the people not to mix the wet garbage with the dry waste or else the mixed garbage will not be collected. He also urged public participation to prevent roadside dumping of garbage which is a major concern. He said they will first streamline the garbage collection within the village for making Chinchinim garbage free.

He also urged the villagers to keep a strict vigil on those littering the village and they can send photographs to the panchayat will take action without revealing the identity of the
